Consent Form, Medical Questionnaire, and Aftercare Instructions

Safe Body Art Act - Section 119303

All forms must have the following information.

Consent form:

- A description of the procedure.
- A description of what the client should expect following the procedure, including suggested care and any medical complications that may occur as a result of the procedure.
- A statement regarding the permanent nature of body art.
- Notice that tattoo inks, dyes, and pigments have not been approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration and that the health consequences of using these products are unknown.

Medical questionnaire:

- Whether the client may be pregnant.
- Whether the client has a history of:
 - o herpes infection at the proposed procedure site
 - diabetes
 - o allergic reactions to latex or antibiotics
 - o hemophilia or other bleeding disorder
 - o cardiac valve disease
- Whether the client has a history of medication use or is currently using medication, including being prescribed antibiotics prior to dental or surgical procedures.
- Other risk factors for bloodborne pathogen exposure.

Aftercare instructions:

- Information on the care of the procedure site.
- Restrictions on physical activities such as bathing, recreational water activities, gardening, or contact with animals, and the duration of the restrictions.
- Signs and symptoms of infection include, but are not limited to, redness, swelling, tenderness of the procedure site, red streaks going from the procedure site towards the heart, elevated body temperature, or purulent drainage from the procedure site.
- Seek medical care if you experience these signs and symptoms of infection.
